Frederick Lewis is a documentary filmmaker and a Professor in the School of Media Arts and Studies at Ohio University and is currently writing a Rockwell Kent biography. Mr. Lewis will be a guest of the Trust at its Kent Cottage June, 2011.

Educated at Brown University (M.A. Creative Writing) and received an undergraduate degree from the University of Massachusetts (B.A. English). His areas of expertise include narrative production, documentary studies and production scriptwriting.

Mr. Lewis was a producer, writer, director and program/production manager in New England for 14-years. He has received numerous grants, awards and nominations for his documentaries aired on PBS stations throughout North America and screened at various universities, film festivals and museums, including the National Gallery of Art.

Mr. Lewis has taught at Boston University and the Rhode Island School of Design. Internationally, he has taught at The Northern Film School in Leeds, Yorkshire, UK and the University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy in Ukraine and has been a U.S. Embassy lecturer at Martin Luther University Halle-Wittenberg and the University of Freiburg. He has designed and directed International Study programs in Malaysia, Guyana, Germany and Ireland (2011). His many projects have taken him to Russia, Greenland, Argentina, Chile (sailing to Cape Horn), Denmark, Ireland, and Newfoundland.
